What is SKIF?

SKIF is a Jewish youth movement that runs activities and camps for children aged 8-18. Our events are run by young adults who have been to SKIF and want to share the awesome experience with other young people. All helfer have first aid training, Working with Children Checks and police checks.

SKIF has three ideologies (values) that our culture and activities are based on:

- 1. Chavershaft Promoting equality, empathy and social awareness.
- 2. Yiddishkayt Celebrating the Yiddish language and secular Jewish life.
- 3. Doikayt Embracing our unique Melbourne-based Jewishness and supporting other Jewish communities around the world.

We love Yiddish at SKIF! Some words that may be new to you are:

- Helfer: Leader at SKIF
- SKIFist: Someone who goes to SKIF
- Apel: Roll call at the start of SKIF activities
- A hunt: A 'hand' when you see a helfer holding their hand up, it means you need to listen to them!
- Shtile minut: A 'silent moment' before we eat so that we can all start eating together
- Forzitser: Head of the helfer group
- The Bund: SKIF's parent organization, like a grown-up version of SKIF

- Putting safety first.
- Treating everyone with respect and requiring SKIFistn to do the same.

- Reporting concerns to the forzitser if it is a matter of safety. The forzitser may need to speak to someone else (your parents, the Bund, the police) to help keep us all safe.
